



Sunday Worship Service Safety Protocols

PLEASE NOTE: *The following safety protocols will be enlisted during our Sunday morning worship services. These protocols are based on best practices for group gatherings during the COVID-19 pandemic.*

What the Church Staff and Facilities will Provide for Individual Safety:

- Hand sanitizing stations will be provided throughout the building.
- Physical contact with non-family members will be discouraged.
- Necessary doors will be propped open.
- Please allow 6 feet of separation between family groups in Worship Center seating to provide adequate social distancing.
- Ushers will be available to seat people to aid with social distancing protocols.
- Restrooms will be cleaned and sanitized before and after all services
- Worship Service hours will be at 9am and 11am to provide adequate time to clean and sanitize public spaces between services.
- All Team Members/Volunteers who will be in direct contact with church attendees will be asked to wear a facemask.
- No offering plates will be passed. Drop off stations for offering will be located outside the Worship Center doors.
- Nursery, Preschool, Children, and Youth programs will only be offered during the 9am Sunday Worship Service beginning Sunday, July 12.

What is asked of people who will be attending our Worship Services:

- Before leaving home for any on-site church activity, individuals should assess themselves for the symptoms of COVID-10 by answering YES or NO, in the last 10 days, have I had any of the following:
 1. A fever (100.4°F or higher) or a sense of having a fever?
 2. Chills that cannot be attributed to another health condition?
 3. A new cough that cannot be attributed to another health condition?
 4. Shortness of breath that cannot be attributed to another health condition?
 5. A sore throat that cannot be attributed to another health condition?
 6. Muscle aches (myalgia) that cannot be attributed to another health condition or specific activity (such as physical exercise)?
 7. Have I had prolonged exposure to someone who has tested positive for COVID-19?
 8. Is there any medical reason why I shouldn't be around others?

If an individual answers “**YES**” to any one of the questions, they (as well as all members of the household) should remain home and worship through our LIVE broadcast. They should also consider seeking guidance from a healthcare provider.

- If you are sick or are in a high-risk demographic, please continue to watch our livestream in the safety of your home.
- Help our church by self-monitoring social distancing etiquette by following safety protocols listed on this sheet and any additional protocols posted in the building.
