Don't Let Your Home Be Silent

Parents, your child didn't need to be taught how to sin. From their first "no" to sneaking a cookie or telling a lie, their need for a Savior has been clear from the start. That doesn't make them a bad kid, it makes them human. And while only Jesus can rescue them from sin, they need you to be their disciple maker.

Life is full of things that can pull your child away from following Jesus. And one of the biggest threats might come from within your home—not through something you do, but through what you *don't* do: **silence**.

Being a disciple-making parent means having hard conversations and making hard choices. Your child needs to see faith lived out daily—in your priorities, your schedule, your media choices, and your example of putting Jesus first.

Scripture is clear: spiritual conversations should be part of everyday life. Deuteronomy 6:7 says to "repeat [God's commands] diligently... when you sit, walk, lie down, and get up." Don't let silence fill your home. Speak often about Jesus and God's truth. If your voice isn't the loudest influence in your child's life, something else will be.

So, don't stay silent. Point your child to the Savior.
