Faithful Priorities

We all hear about getting our priorities in order—but this isn't about guilt. It's about helping you and your family focus on what truly matters most.

Priorities often shift with the season—busy schedules, long days, or even good things like sports and vacations can take over. When life gets full, our relationship with God is usually the first thing pushed aside. Your students are starting to feel that same tension, and they need your help to navigate it.

A common way to think about priorities is like a full plate. But instead of trying to “fit God on the plate,” let's flip that idea. Jesus said in Matthew 22:37–40 to love God with everything. That's not just a top priority—it's the foundation. Your relationship with Jesus isn't something on the plate... it is the plate. As Colossians 3:17 reminds us, everything we do is rooted in Him.

Students need to see this lived out. One simple way to start is by having conversations that shape your family's values:

1. What do we want our family to be known for?
2. What matters most to us?
3. How do we live out our faith together?
4. How do we treat each other in this home?
5. What are our non-negotiables?

These conversations help create clarity, strengthen discipleship, and shape the culture of your home.
